## **BOOK CLUB**

What an eclectic choice of books this time. Victoria Mackenzie For Thy Great Pain have Mercy on my Little Pain (161 pages, 2023), Unsettled Ground by Claire Fuller (287 pages, 2021), Rick Gekoski Guarded by Dragons (240 pages, 2021).

<u>Victoria MacKenzie</u> is a fiction writer, poet and essayist living in Scotland. Her debut novel, For Thy Great Pain Have Mercy On My Little Pain, won the Saltire First Book Award and was long listed for the Walter Scott prize for Historical Fiction. She has won other awards for her short fiction and essays. She works as a freelance Creative Writing tutor and offers one-to-one mentoring.

For Thy Great Pain Have Mercy On My Little Pain was an interesting book to read straight after Matrix because they both deal with the lives of educated women in the Middle Ages, women whose lives were bound up with the spiritual. Matrix was an entirely fictional tale because the actual identity of Marie of France is unknown. Julian of Norwich and Margery Kempe are both known from the writings they left behind.


MacKenzie interleaves the thoughts and lives of Julian and Margery Kempe and shows their differences. Julian recovered from an almost fatal illness and decided to dedicate her life to prayer and contemplation. She became an anchoress, the female version of a hermit, but rather than living in a cave in the wilderness, she lived walled up in a small chamber attached to St Julian's Church, Norwich. So little is known of Julian's early life that she may derive her name from that church. Margery Kempe lived very much in the world. Her father was mayor of Bishop's (now King's) Lynn. She married and had fourteen children. From her own family or via her husband's trade she was wealthy enough to travel extensively to visit sites of pilgrimage. She went to the Holy land, Santiago de Compostela and Prussia. Both these women experienced visions that they believed were divine in origin. Julian, walled up in her cell, kept such things to her self and wrote a secret account. Margery made her visions public and was several times arraigned for heresy. Since Norwich is only sixty miles from Kings Lynn the journey would have been nothing to Margery, who had seen the Holy Land, so she visited Julian.


This was a very successful telling of the two women. MacKenzie chose language that was suitable for the thirteen hundreds but avoided the artificially archaic. The two characters were well drawn, Julian sequestered and secretive, Margery flamboyant and outspoken.

<u>Claire Fuller</u> was born in Oxfordshire in 1967. She studied sculpture at Winchester School of Art in the 1980s. She then went on to work in marketing.

She started to write fiction at the age of forty and holds a master's degree in creative and critical writing from the University of Winchester.







for her short stories and *Unsettled Ground*, her fourth novel, won the Costa Book Awards Novel Award 2021 and was shortlisted for the 2021 Women's Prize for Fiction.

The blurb on the cover of this novel was rather off putting, suggesting that we were in for a harrowing tale of agricultural misery. We were but the book was more interesting then we expected.

The main characters are the twins Jeanie and Julius. Though they are 51 they live in a dilapidated farm cottage with their mother, Dot. The family live on what they can grow or snare. Dot controls the money, all cash, that they get from selling produce or the odd jobs that Julius picks up. Their father is long gone. There is no television but the three of them are accomplished musicians in the folk tradition.

The twins' lives are turned upside down when Dot dies of a stroke. They start to realise how their way of life was held together by their mother's strength and conniving. Jeanie, believing herself to be very frail, has got used to being cosseted by her mother and protected by her brother. The book tells what becomes of them on their own.

This was, at times, a bleak picture of how easily those living on the edge of destitution can fall beyond help. By the end of the book there is, perhaps, not a happy ending but a tolerable one. We all enjoyed this book mainly because it generated a longer and more interesting discussion than many of the books we have read recently.

Richard Abraham Gekoski Is an American born British writer, broadcaster, book dealer and lecturer. He was born in 1944. He graduated summa cum laude (which means in the top group) from Pennsylvania University in 1966. He was awarded various awards and fellowships. He moved to Merton College, Oxford and gained a B Phil and a D Phil in English and also a tennis blue. In 1971 he became a lecturer at Warwick University and was promoted to senior lecturer in 1980. He resigned in 1984 to turn his part time interest into a profession and became a dealer in rare books.

Guarded by Dragons is by way of being a memoir in thirteen chapters, each telling the story of an acquisition or sale in Gekoski's book dealing life. His interests change from hunting for first and rare editions to arranging the sorting and selling of manuscripts and archives. These are the most interesting chapters because they describe discussions with writers and their agents and also the time consuming and painstaking work behind sorting archives that might fill an aircraft hangar. Gekioski comes over as a pleasant man with a chatty style of writing. Some of the people he deals with come over as selfish, self centred, grasping, arrogant individuals. This book split the group. Some disliked the author, his style and the narrative and some found him an attractive personality with a conversational style and a fascinating life.


